With tears in her eyes, she told me they were looking for a bigger one for the oldest child but could not afford it.

One of the great things about working in the Stiles-Beach Barn is the joy you bring to others. We are in a unique position to help our residents as well as many people in our community.

By an acquisitions team who sorts and packs donated items when a home is vacated, and by a truck crew who picks up and delivers items across the campus. And by a social assistance team who is the face of the Benevolent Fund for our clients.

It is gratifying to know that our efforts continue to be supported by a strong donor base of residents who contribute through their pledges, donations, and bequests.

In August of 2019, Panorama became an affiliate of the **International Low Vision Support Group**, which provides a monthly newsletter and podcast, featuring motivational speakers and leading experts in the fields of low vision

The newest Social Services Advisor, Tiffany Martin, facilitates the group and provides additional follow-up for residents looking for assistance or resources.
